Aim 1: Insights into consent rates

Aim 2: Insights into consent willingness

Collect data on hypothetical willingness to consent to linkage covering four different domains:

- a. administrative information on employment histories
- b. information on pensions or social security contributions
- c. information on income or taxes
- d. information on health
- Comparable data for 27 European countries and Israel
- 39 country-specific language versions
- Independent from specific administrative institution
- Valuable insights into consent behavior of older respondents



What we plan to do

- 1. Response to "real" consent requests from available countries
 - Cross-country comparison of linkage consent rates
 - Bivariate analyses with focus on language, country, and socio-demographics
 - Multivariate modeling including interactions, especially of the country indicators with selected variables.
- 2. Response to hypothetical consent willingness
 - Same strategy
 - Four outcome variables, one for each domain of administrative data
 - Over 28 countries
 - Country differences and differences between domains
 - Differences between the results for the real and hypothetical consent questions
